Who? Additional Artists

Leonardo da Vinci

Using **hatching**. **Leonardo da Vinci** used a drawing technique called “**hatching**”. **Hatching** consists of straight or curved lines drawn close to each other to give the illusion of value. **Da Vinci** was left-handed, and his **hatching** lines went from the upper left down to the lower right.
