Thank you Miss Condren for your passion and enthusiasm for EYFS and thank you to Miss Cook for leading our singing assemblies and all the work you have done with PE. Miss Phoebe Newman is also leaving us this summer, she is taking a break from teaching and will be travelling around the world. Miss Newman - thank you so much for all the work you have done this year on our History curriculum. Finally, Mrs Amy Adams is leaving to move to a new school closer to home. There are not enough words to express our gratitude for all the work Mrs Adams has done with SEND. Next year, we welcome several new members to Team Hayes. We also have Ms Gaynor Rispoli joining us as a teaching assistant.

Although school will be closed for the children, it will remain open while we have various works completed. When you return in September, there will be a 'secure line' fence around part of the field, school and playgrounds. We have been able to pay for this following a successful Condition Improvement Fund (CIF) bid, which recognised that the school is not currently as secure as it could be. The secure line is being put in as a safeguarding measure and will mean that anyone entering the school site, outside of drop and pick up times, will have to come through the main reception. It will mean that we can control entry and exit points which will reduce the risk of outsiders entering the school.

You will also notice that we will have new playground markings in the small playground. This is being funded by the PTA, for which we are very grateful. The children are going to love them.

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I would like to take this opportunity to say a huge thank you to all our Hayes Primary School families for being so welcoming and supportive over this past year. Our most recent Ofsted report noted that our school is 'a close-knit community filled with friendliness and warm and caring relationships' and I could not agree more. I look forward to building on our successes next year.
