HPS Athletics Team

On Thursday 29 June, twenty-four year 5/6 children took part in the Large Schools Bromley Primary Schools Athletics competition at Norman Park.

Each child had been chosen to take part in a particular event, 75m & 150m sprints, 600m run, standing long jump, running long jump and howler throw. Each school was allowed 2 children per event, per boys and girls team.

In the morning session, heats for the sprints took place, with the children being put into finals for the afternoon session. The 600m races were run as finals then the field events took place. The top 8 children from this event were invited back to the individual finals in July to compete against the other finalists from the small, medium and large schools. The morning finished with each school taking part in a 14x40m shuttle relay race.

In the afternoon session, the finals of the sprint races and the field events took place. The top 8 children from each event were then invited back to the individual finals in July to compete against the other finalists from the small, medium and large schools. To finish off the afternoon a 5x80m relay took place.

Overall HPS children did fantastically, finishing 2nd overall out of 13 schools, only 1point behind Oak Lodge who won! 10 out of 24 children were invited back to the individual finals which take place on 13 July: Bertie, Elsie, Frank, Bruce, Esther, Eva, Oliver, Harry, Ivana, Reuben.

On Thursday 13 July, 10, year 6 Hayes Primary School children took part in the Bromley Primary Schools Individual Athletics finals at Norman Park. The children had qualified for these finals by finishing in the top 8 of their event at the Large Schools Athletics competition two weeks previously. Over 2000 children from across the borough have taken part in different athletic competitions throughout June and the individual finals were represented by the top 24 children across the borough in each event.

We had some amazing results with Eva finishing 2nd in the 600 metre race, Ivana finishing 3rd in the Standing Long jump, Frank finishing 3rd and Bruce finishing 6th in the 150 metres race, Bertie finishing 5th in the 75 metre race and Esther finishing 6th in the 150 meter race. An amazing achievement by all the children.



Other Sports News

We were delighted to hear about Isabella who is in Year 4, how well she is doing in tennis.

Isabella started playing tennis as a recreational player in November 2021 in red balls. After only a few months she realised that she really liked it and started taking it more seriously. In April she was moved to orange balls and she started taking once a week one to one lessons. She soon realised that she had to catch up and work hard if she wanted to achieve her dream of competing, so she started practicing every day at the park with her dad. By August 2022 she competed in the Kent Championship, her first official

tournament. She was then spotted by the Kent LTA and invited to participate in a trial to be part of the Kent squat. Isabella was successfully selected to participate in the Kent squat training, with a chance to be selected to play in the County Cup if she performed well.

By September 2022 she started training in the performance squad of Bromley Tennis Centre (regional development club) and then in November 2022 she successfully passed the test for the performance squat of The Park Langley club (Where Emma Raducanu started her tennis journey.)

Isabella currently goes twice a week to the Park Langley performance squad and also to Strength and conditioning classes. She does a one to one class with the Head of Performance at the Park langley club and former Emma Raducanu coach, and she attends once a month to the Kent Squad training, as well as training regularly with her dad at the park on the Tennis for Free Courts.



Isabella has won a second place in grade 5 tournament, 2 second places and one first place at grade 4 tournaments, and got number 6 and number 4 in two grade 3 tournaments, amongst other tournaments where she was placed amongst the first 5 places.

Isabella recently participated in her first grade 2 National Tournament at Bath University where she got number 22 out of the best 36 9U girls in the UK. This has been an amazing experience where Isabella competed across 2 days, and trained with National coaches for 1 hour before the tournament started.

Isabella has also recently played for the U9 girls Kent squad at the County Cup finals at Bath University Sports Village. Having to play a number of single and double matches against girls from 4 counties: Avon, South Wales, Hertfordshire and Middlesex. The squad did amazingly finishing 3rd receiving bronze medals.

Isabella's LTA recent form ranking points means she is currently amongst the top 4 9U players in Kent, competing at national Level.



We were also delighted to hear how well Harry from year 6 has done in The Boys National Championships in Sports Acrobatics winning gold in May. Well done Harry, another fantastic achievement.
