





<b>What? (Key Knowledge)</b>	
Why would we collect data about a population?	Geographers collect data to make plans for cities, e.g. better old people's homes if population is older or more schools if it is younger
Why do people choose to settle somewhere?	People choose to settle somewhere because of what it offers (e.g. natural resources) and accessibility (e.g. transport links) but also what is affordable.
What affects birth and death rates?	<i>Births:</i> Laws, better job opportunities, good health care
	<i>Deaths:</i> Poor health care, war, natural disasters, poor sanitation
If there are more people living somewhere what impact could that have?	<i>Positive:</i> more buildings, cultural diversity, better opportunities
	<i>Negative:</i> lack of jobs, increased air pollution, lack of housing, overcrowding, pressure on resources

Population	123,000 	the number of people living in a certain place
Population increase		When the number of births is higher than the number of deaths
Population decrease		When the number of deaths is higher than the number of births
Demography		The study of human populations, including the age, gender, culture of the population
Population distribution		The pattern of where people live
Densely populated		Places where a lot of people live
Sparsely populated		Places that are difficult places to live so not many people live there
Migration		A long journey to a new home which is usually a permanent move
Deprivation		Something is missing and the situation is serious
