How can you donate?

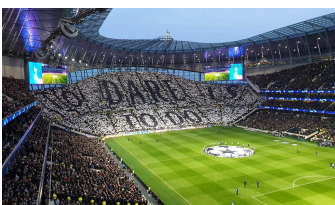
There are lots of charities in the world that raise money and help out lots of people in need.

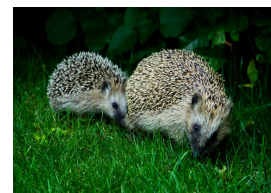

What is a Guinness World Record?

A Guinness World Record is a formally acknowledged achievement recognized for being the best in a specific skill, activity, or for possessing an unusual characteristic. It is



a title awarded by Guinness World Records, a global authority on record-breaking, to celebrate superlative feats and achievements.

Record-Breaking Records

On November 27th 2012, Nick Stoeberl from California found out that he was in the Guinness World Records for the longest tongue in the world. His tongue measures 10.1 cm (3.97 inches) long.

On the 13th March 2022, Diana Armstrong from the USA found out she had a Guinness World Record for the longest fingernails in the world. Her nails combined the length of 1,306.58 cm (42 feet 10.4 inches) long. Diana Armstrong has been growing her fingernails for over 25 years!

Coollest Record

On December 16th 2011, when she had just turned 18, Jyoti Kishanji Amge found out that she had been awarded a Guinness World Record for being the shortest woman on earth. Jyoti Kishanji Amge is an Indian actress. On her 18th birthday she was 62.8cm tall.

On September 13, 2008, Barbora Špotáková found out that she was in the Guinness World Records for the farthest javelin throw in the world (for women). Her throw went up to 72.28 meters!

This is a massive problem because as the world is warming up, ice glaciers are melting. This causes sea levels to rise. This problem affects coastal areas and in dangerous cases people have to

evacuate their homes. This causes extreme weather such as: heat waves, droughts and wildfires. In July 2022, the UK experienced its first-ever 40 degrees celsius weather, which would have been extremely unlikely without climate change. The oceans of the world are really important for many reasons. For starters, they cover over 70% of the world. Many wildlife lives here and more but that's not what we are talking about right now. The oceans are getting warmer and are causing marine heatwaves. Another bad thing is that every year, 11 million tons of plastic waste enters the ocean. Although there are many effects affecting the oceans, the last one we're going to talk about is ocean acidification. This is really bad; harmful chemicals that kill fish and other marine animals destroy many coral reefs and other marine plants (as fish eat and help populate, e.g. algae).

Human Health

Last but not least, literal human health. As well as animals, plants and trees, humans are also affected by climate change. Increased heat-related illnesses, respiratory problems, and the spread of infectious disease are just a couple of problems affecting humans (due to climate change).
