On a dry and bright Saturday morning of 8th November, thirty boys and girls attended the annual Year 5 and 6 Cross Country meeting at Crystal Palace Park. With 56 borough schools taking part and 923 runners in total.

Due to the Crystal Palace Park redevelopment, there was a new course which started uphill for the children to run and by all accounts seemed much harder than in previous years.

The first race taking place was the Year 5 girls with sufficient runners to form a team of 5. Emma was the 1st to finish for Hayes in 73rd place out of 220 runners, then came Sophia 120, Amber 121, Niamh 133 and Mia 150. Overall, the team finished 20/32 teams

The second race was Year 5 boys and once again with enough to form a team. Finley came 7th out of 258 runners, then Harry 98th, Austin 104, Nico 199, Oliver 235, Elliot 240, Tristan 241 and Elliot 243. Overall, the team finished 22/35 teams.

The third race was Year 6 girls with sufficient runners to form a team. Maisie came 13th out of 204 runners then Sophie 24th, Aria 58th, Bethany 61st, Bettie 88th, Rebecca 89 and Milly 129. Overall, the team finished 4/29 teams.

The final race was Year 6 boys, and again with sufficient runners to form a team. Finley finished 20th out of 240 runners, Malachy 31st, Arthur 53rd, James 184, Dylan 197, Lewis 212. Overall, the team finished 15/34 teams.
