# Why Music?

Music education, like all other areas of education influences a child's general development. Music education has a particular formative power – this is partly because of the complex effect of music on the emotions.

One effect of music is that it can help a child become emotionally balanced. Through exposure to high quality music, and in making music, a child's emotional world becomes richer, more varied and deeper. There are also positive physiological changes that occur, particularly when singing.

Social development improves through the sensitive interaction needed in making music together. Confidence grows as children play musical games, perform to their peers and move forward with new found skills and knowledge.

Through experimenting and creating their own musical works, a child can experience the thrill of making something new and find a route to self-expression. The imagination becomes enhanced with sound imagery.

Learning the words of a song, the melody and the actions, all develop a child's memory.

Music education presents opportunity for thought processes – concepts such as fast/slow, high/low. There is an inherent logic to the structure of songs.

Concentration, language development, co-ordination, listening skills all improve, and so on and so on.....

Through the development of musicianship skills, a child is well equipped should they wish to take their musical interests further - maybe studying a specific instrument.

A love of music emerges, which can inspire a life-long musical journey.

Through the carefully chosen repertoire in the classes, a child can be transported beyond the everyday existence into the realm of ideas and dreams, where true art lies – that which can transform and enhance our lives.
