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What? (Key Knowledge)

The Creation Story

In the beginning - God started creation.
The first day - light was created.
The second day - the sky was created.
The third day - dry land, seas, plants and trees were created.
The fourth day - the Sun, Moon and stars were created.
The fifth day - creatures that live in the sea and creatures that fly were created.
The sixth day - animals that live on the land and finally humans, made in the image of God, were created.

Adam and Eve

The first two humans that God created to live on Earth. They were the last things to be created, and made to be like God on earth.

The seventh day of rest - Sunday

On day seven - God finished his work of creation and rested, making the seventh day a special holy day. For Christians, this is Sunday. The seven days make up one week.
