<b>What? (Key Knowledge)</b>		<b>Attainment Targets</b>																	
What does Passover celebrate?	Exodus from Egypt under <b>Moses</b> God who allowed the Israelites to be free from slavery. On the night they escaped He asked them to remember this night forever and gave them certain instructions i.e. told them to eat certain things, daub blood on their door posts, etc.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>I can talk about why I do as some people ask but not others.</li> <li>I can talk about the Seder meal, or another Jewish practice, with some detail and some of the correct vocabulary, and start to explain why they choose to do this.</li> <li>I can suggest what I think are the most and least important things Jews do that God asks them to do and add at least one reason.</li> </ul>																	
What is Passover?	Passover is also known as <b>Pesach</b> . It remembers the time in Egypt when the angel of death passed over each house to save the firstborn. Passover is celebrated for seven or eight days.	<b>Key Questions</b>																	
Why do Jews celebrate Passover?	Passover and the Seder meal are one way Jews remember their special relationship with God. They do as He asked and celebrate Passover to remember the Exodus.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><u>How important is it for Jewish people to do what God asks them to do?</u></li> <li>What do we mean by 'respect'?</li> <li>Why was it important that the Jews did as God asked on the Passover night?</li> <li>How does the way Jews celebrate Passover tell us about how important it is for them to do as God asks?</li> <li>How would a non-religious person explain the events of the Passover?</li> </ul>																	
The <b>Seder</b> meal. 	A special <b>kosher</b> meal Jewish families have once a year at the Festival of Passover. All the foods on the plate represent something from the story of Passover. The foods are: <b>Matzah</b> (bread), <b>Charoset</b> (dried fruit), <b>Zeroah</b> (lamb), <b>Beitzah</b> (egg), <b>Maror</b> (bitter herb), <b>Karpas</b> (parsley), <b>Chazeret</b> (lettuce).	<b>What?
