Edvard Munch	<ul> <li>Edvard Munch was born in Norway in 1863.</li> <li>He was a painter and print-maker.</li> <li>He greatly influenced the development of the artistic style known as German expressionism.</li> <li>In that style, the artist seeks to portray emotions and responses to the world, rather than realistic depictions of its objects and events.</li> <li>His work often included the portrayal of such themes as misery, sickness, and death. <i>The Scream</i>, or <i>The Cry</i> (1893), was probably his most familiar painting.</li> <li>Munch's parents, a brother, and a sister died while he was still young, which probably contributed to the bleakness of much of his work.</li> </ul>
