<b>What? (Key Knowledge)</b>		<b>Attainment Targets</b>	
<b>Baptism</b>	Baptism is a ceremony that symbolises a commitment to living a life as a Christian. Holy water is put on a person being baptised by a <b>church</b> leader as a symbol of being cleansed and made ready for a new life for God.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>I can explain some of the feelings my special place gives me and suggest why that is.</li> <li>I can describe some of the ways Christians use churches. (worship, celebrate, Holy Communion, baptism etc.)</li> <li>I can start to understand the impact a Christian's special place has on him/her.</li> </ul>

<b>Holy Communion</b>	Christians have a special 'meal to do just what Jesus did. They break bread to remember his body (death) and drink juice/wine to remember his blood. Christians remember that Jesus died for them and forgave them.	<b>What? (Key vocab)</b>

	John the Baptist was Jesus' cousin and understood Jesus' special purpose on earth, hence baptising him in the River Jordan.	<b>Definition</b>	
<b>Styles of worship</b>	Worship varies according to the type of church. Evangelical worship is joyous and lively yet Quakers worship is silent and contemplative.	The Last Supper	The final meal that Jesus shared with his disciples before his death.
