

COVID-19 Testing - Lateral Flow Device Tests

If your child has symptoms of Coronavirus, we are unable to accept a negative lateral flow test as evidence of them not having the virus. Public Health England require the result of a PCR test so we must have the result of a negative PCR test before your child can return to school.

Therefore, if your child or a member of your household displays symptoms of Coronavirus, you must self-isolate with your household immediately and book a PCR test. Once this test result has been confirmed, if negative, your child or children can return to school straight away. If positive, you must follow the Government rules for self-isolation.

The intended use of lateral flow tests is for asymptomatic testing in adults and not for when someone is displaying symptoms. The NHS do not advise children to take lateral flow tests.

Reporting Illnesses – Details of symptoms must be given

Could we please kindly ask that, when you are reporting an absence for your child due to illness, ***the full symptoms of the illness are provided.*** We are then able to record the illness absence correctly, and are able to identify common illnesses in a particular class or year group. Please see and follow the COVID-19 Symptoms Protocols circulated on September 9th should your child display any of the COVID-19 symptoms. We appreciate your cooperation and support in this matter.

Any absences have to be reported to the school no later than 9am. ***An absence MUST be reported every day until your child returns to school, even if this is a continued absence.*** This ensures we can follow our Safeguarding procedures.

Change of Collection

Should you have a change in collection and the person collecting is not on your authorised list, an email is sent to admin@hayes-pri.bromley.sch.uk before midday on the day of collection. This is to ensure the message is received and acknowledged by class teacher before the end of the school day.

Hayfever and sunny weather

If your child suffers from hayfever, could you please ensure that antihistamine medication is given to your child before coming into school in the morning. This will ensure your child is protected, will prevent symptoms from developing, and they will therefore be able to focus and concentrate in class.

Due to the fact that the children are using the outside areas throughout the day, please ensure that, before your child comes to school, you:

- Apply long-lasting, high factor sunscreen, especially to their face and neck;
- Provide a sunhat that protects their head, face and neck;
- Provide a water bottle.

Riding scooters and bikes on the one-way system

We have noticed that some children are riding their bikes or scooters when travelling around the one-way system on the school site. Please can we ask that when entering the school grounds, your child dismounts from their scooter or bike and walks with it.

Dogs not permitted on school site

Please be reminded that dogs are not permitted on the school site. Therefore, please refrain from bringing dogs onto the school premises, this includes dogs that are carried, or are in carriers. Many thanks for your cooperation in this matter.

Face Coverings

To help protect everyone, please wear a face covering on the school site unless you are exempt from wearing one.

Morning staggered drop off times

To minimise the number of children and adults walking around the school site, we have staggered drop off times. The only exception to this is if you have another child or children with an earlier drop off slot. You are then able to drop all your children off in this earlier slot.

There seems to be a lot of children arriving at school earlier than their scheduled drop off time when they do not have a sibling with an earlier drop off. This is reducing the impact that a staggered start time is intended to have. Please adhere to your child's drop off as follows:

EYFS, Y2 and Y6 08:40 – 08:50

Y1 and Y4 08:55 – 09:05

Y3 and Y5 09:10 – 09:20

Please continue to use the one-way system in place for entering and exiting the site.

Nut Free school

Please be reminded that we are a nut-free school and this includes pesto. Please refrain from including nut-based foods in your child's packed lunch.

School Office is currently closed

The main School Reception is currently closed, and therefore we are not able to accept forgotten items.

Therefore, please ensure your child has all of their belongings with them when they come into school in the morning.

When contacting the school office via email, if you could please provide the full name of your child and their class, this would be really appreciated. This will assist us in forwarding and responding to your request more effectively. Many thanks for your support in this matter.
