Medication

14.45pm – 15.45pm. There will be a barrier across George Lane, just after the Hayes Wood Avenue turning, during these times.

Breakfast/Afterschool Clubs parents and carers can drop children at Breakfast club by car, parking on the KS2 playground, but must leave the school site well in advance of 8.30am when the street will be closed. Parents can collect their children by car from clubs run after school and park on the KS2 playground when the street re-opens at 15.45pm.

What to do if your child has COVID symptoms

You must not send your child in to school if they have COVID symptoms which include:

- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal.

They must isolate and take a PCR test as soon as possible.

If a child is feeling unwell during the school day, we will inform you and you will be asked to collect your child and take them home to isolate and book a PCR test.

Isolation

You are required to isolate if you test positive for COVID-19 and follow the current government isolation guidance.

Current government guidance states that children and adults who have been fully vaccinated, are not required to isolate if they are a close contact of somebody who tests positive for COVID.

Finally, this year, we are looking forward to being able to reintroduce events that we have had to forgo over the past two academic years such as class assemblies and school trips. We will send further information out about these in due course.
